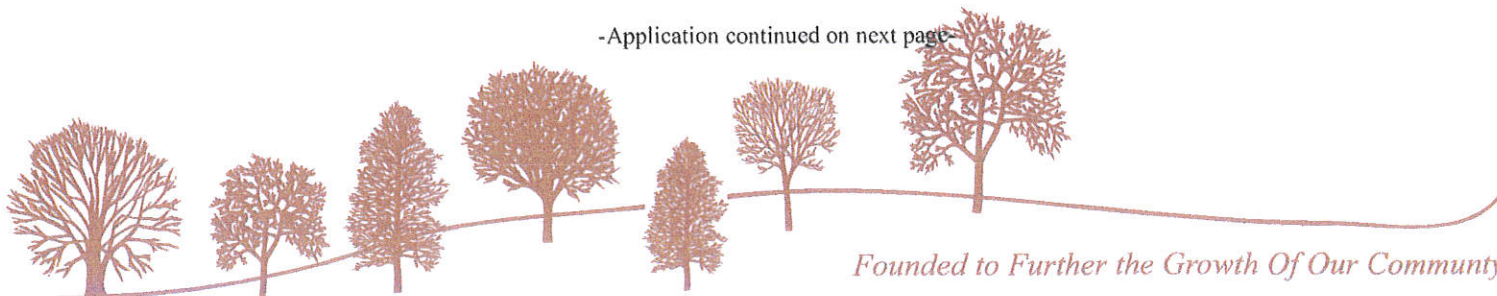

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In conversation with the administration of Iowa-Grant I learnt the school has been blessed with donated school supplies such as pencils, notebooks crayons, scissors, etc. by Cummins Emissions Solutions of Mineral Point and individuals of the school district. The funds for Iowa-Grant would be spent for children first thru eighth grade in need of headphones, earbuds and calculators these items are expected to be supplied by the student and are not donated. Funds may also be spent on hats, gloves and coats for the less fortunate children as the weather changes.

In conversation with the administration in Highland, they are in need of back to school supplies.

We are the Highland Mobile Food Pantry who has been in existence for six years. On one Monday of each month, an 18 wheeler from Second Harvest in Madison backs up to our parish center and we unload food for our waiting clients. The selection is varied-canned goods, frozen meats, cereals, vegetables, fruits, baked goods and dairy products. We serve approximately 200 families with small children who are experiencing challenges with making ends meet.
