Charitable purpose of the organization.

The Suicide Prevention Coalition of Iowa County is dedicated to reducing the occurrence of suicidal behaviors among Iowa County's 23,749 residents of all ages. We intend to increase awareness and create a safe environment in which residents know they are not alone and can access the resources they need to help themselves, family or friends that may be having suicidal thoughts. Our mission is to prevent suicide through awareness, education, collaboration and improved access to mental health care. While focusing on Iowa County, we hope to provide information to the residents of our neighboring counties as well which is another 185804 people.

Organization's current programs, activities, and recent accomplishments

Established on August 11, 2014 we have come a long way in a short time thanks to your generous grants. This past year, 2017, we have continued our communications with Iowa County Sheriff's department on what type of trainings we could offer their officers. We have also continued our work with Upland Hills Health to distribute Suicide Prevention brochures in all of their clinics, continued training of their staff and employees along with, officers, EMT's and community members on QPR. QPR, developed by QPR Institute, Spokane, WA, stands for Question, Persuade and Refer, three steps anyone can learn to help prevent suicide. We also assisted the Wisconsin Dairy Producers and Lands End to provide more trainings. We teamed up with Lands End to train their Leads in QPR at the Dodgeville, Reedsburg and Stevens Point locations. The Wisconsin Dairy Producers set up QPR Trainings in October in eight different locations in Wisconsin.

We continue our monthly Survivors of Suicide (SOS) Peer Support Group Meetings and hosted another Suicide Memorial Walk this year at Harris Park in Dodgeville. Our website <http://www.suicide-iowacountywi.org/> is up and running along with our Facebook page and Instagram account. We are still working with local chamber of commerce's and schools to brainstorm on what can be done to spread the suicide prevention message in order to break down stigmas.

Purpose of the request.

2018 Goals--- Education the public through public service announcements. "Burden of Suicide on Wisconsin report" from the WI Department of Health shows Iowa county has the highest suicide rate in southwestern WI. Males ages 45-54 with the lowest therapeutic resources. However, the interesting findings are that 86% of Iowa County feels they have a support system in place through family, friends or coworkers. So, it is our responsibility to have a mass campaign of public service announcements encouraging people to start those tough conversations on suicide and informing people of where to find resources and help. These public service announcements will also break down the negative stigmas related to mental health issues and suicide.

Funds are being sought to provide public service announcements on Channel 47 and Channel 3. We also need funds to maintain and host our website.

Amount requested and the desired time line for the receipt of any contribution.

The amount requested is \$12,300 which is broken down as follows:
\$7,500 to air Public Service Announcements on Channel 47 & 3 (\$2,500 per month X 3 months) Jan., February, March. February has the highest suicide rate in Wisconsin and southwestern Wisconsin so the idea is to spread awareness and resources before, during and after the highest month.

\$4,800.00 to fund two support groups lead by a professionally trained therapist. These will be lead simultaneously for the caregiver and the attempt victim:

"Caring for someone after a suicide attempt" (\$200 hr. X 12 hrs = \$2,400)

"Coping after a suicide attempt" (\$200 hr. X 12 hrs = \$2,400)

A gift of any amount from the Elmer G. Biddick Charitable Foundation would be used to fund these projects.

Budget of how the funds will be allocated and whether there are any other matching funds involved.

Since our budget of how funds will be allocated depends on the amount of funds we can raise. The items we have requested funding for are our top priorities for the year 2018.

In 2017 the Helicopter Golf Ball Drop earned \$5,200. \$1,500 of the earnings has been used to update our tri-fold brochures, \$250 was spent on business card with resources for schools and we plan on spend \$3,500.00 on T-Shirts for area High School Sports Awareness Nights. There are no matching funds involved. We limit our spending to what we raise.

If we were able to have unlimited funding we would like to spend
\$30,000 (\$2,500 per month) TV Public Service Announcement for Channel 47 and Channel 3
\$40,000 to hire a full-time suicide advocate for the county
\$12,000 to get Telecounseling in the Sheriff's Dept. and hospital (Remote therapist)

Last year we fortunate to receive a grant from the Jennie Olson Foundation which along with your grant was our major funding for 2016. We plan to apply to the Jennie Olson Foundation again this year.

Plan for evaluating the use of any contribution.

The use of any contribution will be dependent on the amount of funds donated along with funds raised via other avenues. Our goal is to accomplish the above mentioned projects this coming year.

Organization's current annual budget.



Gentlemen:

You are not liable for the taxes imposed under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) unless you file a waiver of exemption certificate as provided in such act. You are not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act.
