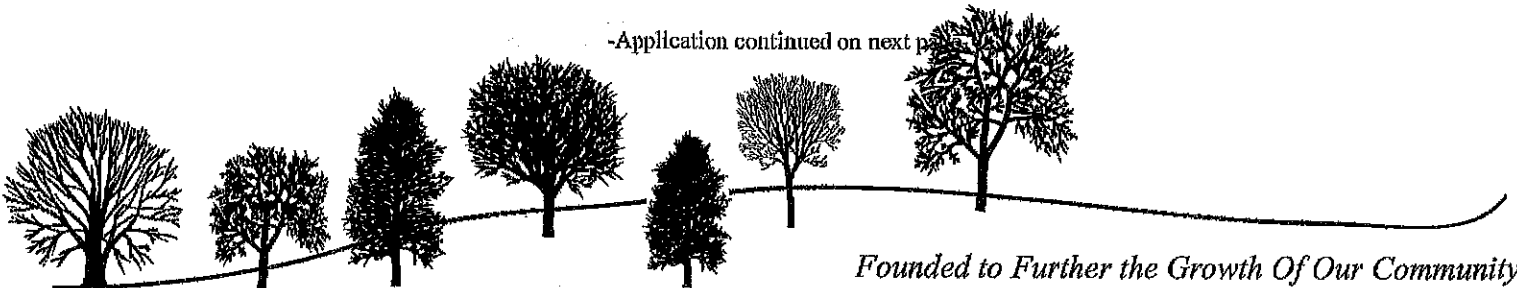

- A. (1) This grant will be used to continue to purchase food and other necessary items to provide for needy families. It will also help to fund food vouchers given to families to help them get milk, bread, eggs, cheese and meat products from the Friendly Place. (2) The LCIC food pantry operates twice per month all year round helping families. (3) Other sources of funding comes from generous individuals, businesses and churches. We do not receive federal or state funding. (4) The potential effect of postponing our request to another time is that the pantry runs the risk of running low or out of funding. We have seen an increase in the number of people using the pantry, and thus our funding needs have increased. (5) The effects of this grant will be felt immediately by those we serve. We are grateful that we have been able to have a food pantry in this community when pantries in other communities are shutting down.
- B. The Livingston Community Improvement Corporation has been in this community since 1992, and has been here to support and promote our local businesses and members of our community and the Iowa Grant School District. The LCIC heads up the annual Livingston Community Festival in June, it helps provide for the food pantry, it sponsors scholarships for graduating IG seniors, promotes activities throughout the year (music in the park, games/trivia nights, annual Turkey Trot 5K run/walk, etc.) The organization is made up of people and businesses who have paid membership dues. There is a Board of Directors and an executive committee comprised of a President, Vice President, Secretary & Treasurer.
